The "If" Button

Tuesday night I made the mistake of watching the election results. Certainly, I watched with anticipation of a victory, but through the course of the evening and on into hours past midnight it was apparent no decision would be made as to a victor. Tragically, and much expected, the deceptions, lies and manipulations seemed to take over the focus of the commentaries.

Through the course of the evening, the Fox News commentator, Bill Hemmer, kept going to a total board and updated results as they came in. He had a variety of options on the display board and one I found most interesting was the "if" button. He could manipulate the winner in individual states to satisfy a hypothetical outcome for either candidate. "If Trump takes these two states, he is on track to 270 electoral votes and a second term." According to <u>philosophy-religion.blurtit.com</u>, "if" appears in the Bible **1521 times**. 1029 times in the <u>Old Testament</u> and 492 times in the New Testament. Aside from the many uses as a conjunction; it seems that God used "if" more as noun as a condition. "And the Lord said, **IF** I find in Sodom fifty righteous within the city, then I will spare all the place for their sakes."- **Gen.18:26.** (plus 1029 more time just in the Old Testament!) "My son, **if** thou wilt receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee, So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to understanding, Yea **if** thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding, **If** thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as hid treasures; Then shalt thou understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God."- **Prov.2:1-5.** We do, God acts. "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land."-Isa.1:19. God presents His desire and the condition and clearly lets us know what the outcome will be.
